

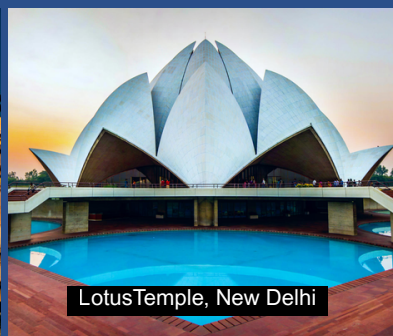

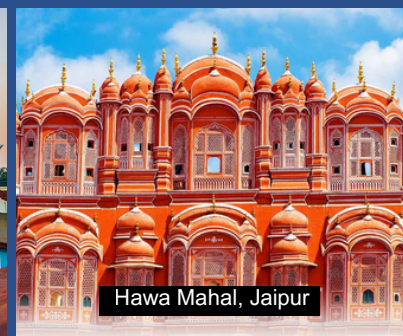

Their first initiative was for Rotary Youth Exchange Officers visiting India, which led to the much-loved Incredible India Tours — curated journeys that helped Rotary members, families, and friends explore India's heritage and lifestyle with a personal touch.

After successfully hosting eight editions of Incredible India Tours and drawing on over nine years of experience managing Rotary Youth Exchange programs, Bhanu and Divya envisioned expanding their work to create similar cultural experiences for youth.

This vision gave rise to the Discover India brand of Youth Camps, designed exclusively for international young participants to experience India's culture, history, and way of life.

The first Discover India Adventure Camp, held in July 2025, brought together youth from across the world for a journey of connection, learning, and cultural immersion. Building on its success, the Discover India International Youth Camps continue to offer life-changing experiences that celebrate India's diversity, values, and traditions.

It is specially designed for youths from Rotary Community, Rotary member families and their friends , offering them an opportunity to explore India's culture, history, and lifestyle in a safe and enriching environment. The program is organised with the same care, values, and zero-tolerance safety standards that guide Rotary Youth Exchange programs.

📌 Ahmedabad – Heritage Capital of Gujarat

More than 600 year old Walled City of Ahmedabad founded by Ahmed Shah has been declared India's first World Heritage City, recognising heritage value of the walled city's unique heritage.

📌 Udaipur – The City of Lakes

Udaipur is also known as the 'City of Lakes'. It is the historic capital of the kingdom of Mewar. It was founded in 1559 by Udai Singh II of the Sisodia clan of Rajputs. It remained the capital city till 1818 when it became a British princely state, and thereafter the Mewar province became a part of Rajasthan when India gained independence in 1947. Udaipur has seven lakes surrounding the city.

📌 Jaipur – The Royal Pink City

Jaipur is the capital and the largest city of the Indian state of Rajasthan. Jaipur is also known as the Pink City due to the dominant colour scheme of its buildings. Jaipur was founded in 1727 by Sawai Jai Singh, the ruler of Amer, after whom the city is named.

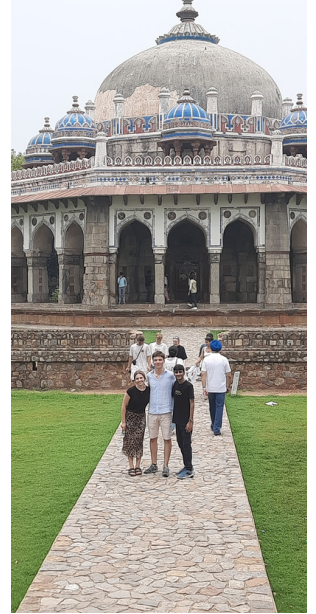
Rishikesh – Spiritual & Adventure Finale
