The Central England Cultural Youth Exchange Camp is a ten-day immersive experience designed for curious, open-minded young adults who want to experience England beyond the surface.

This is not a standard sightseeing trip. It is a shared cultural journey. You will blend history, nature, city life, conversation, and connection, alongside a small group of peers.

This camp brings together just **8 participants from 8 different countries**. This intimate size is deliberate as it creates an environment where meaningful friendships form quickly, conversations go deep, and every experience is truly shared.

This camp is designed to:

- **Explore England's layers** its history, landscapes, and modern identity as an active explorer.
- **Build your confidence, independence, and global awareness** in a supportive setting.
- **Create lasting friendships** that become your global network.

- **Ancient Cathedrals & Heritage:** Stand in spaces that have shaped England for centuries, feeling the weight and wonder of history.
- **The Stories of England:** Discover where key chapters of history unfolded, bringing context to the landscape around you.
- **Natural Landscapes:** Breathe in the fresh air of scenic national parks and rolling hills. This is your space to walk, reflect, and connect as a group.
- **The London Experience:** A full day exploring the iconic energy and landmarks of London, from its historic heart to its modern buzz.

Base Camp

You will need to make your own travel arrangements to Leicester City, in the East Midlands (Central England) where you will be welcomed.

Camp Dates

3-13 August, 2026

Arrivals and departures are permitted only on the specified dates. Participants are responsible for organising their own travel. All arrivals must be to Leicester St Margaret's Bus Station or Leicester Railway Station by 6:00 pm on 3rd August. Participants will be collected from these arrival points. All departures should be planned from Northampton Bus Station or Northampton Railway Station from 12:00 pm onwards on 13th August. Participants will be dropped off at these departure points prior to midday departures.

Accommodation

You will stay at our [main camp hotel](#) for nine nights in same sex rooms (two participants per room). On the final day you will relocate to [another hotel](#), in same sex rooms (two per room) prior to departure the following day.

Participants' Responsibilities

You will be responsible for:-

- Your own travel plans and arrival at St. Margaret's Bus Station in Leicester or Leicester Railway Station.
- Rotary recommended insurance cover
- Passport and visa costs (if applicable)
- Personal spending money
- During free time, participants can organise their own transport to Leicester or Loughborough town centres.
